

## MARINE RESCUE UNIT

### RIB TRAINING REQUIREMENTS 2008

Trainees must be invited to undergo RIB skipper training and have demonstrated satisfactory service as crewmember on roster for a period of six months.

Item	Operation	
1.	Competently operate radios.	
2.	Competently operate GPS, and radar if fitted.	
3.	Knowledge of all equipment carried. Maintenance of RIB and motor.	
4.	Competent driving in river. Figure eights and 180 degree turns. On and off beach in river. Patient pick ups in river.	
5.	Drive RIB over bar under varying conditions. Drive RIB behind waves into broken waves and back out to sea confidently. Drive along beach and back out to sea. Patient pick up at sea. Parallel running.	
6.	Demonstrate competent towing of vessel over bar Managing overturned boats at sea.	
7.	Demonstrate competent driving RIB at night. *Drive Rescue RIB over the bar on ten occasions under varying conditions to the satisfaction of the Training Officer or his appointed delegate.	
8.	Treatment of patient in RIB. Carry patient from RIB to appropriate wharf.	
9.	SAR techniques, close down procedures, logbook & recordkeeping.	
<b>Additionally</b>		
10.	Demonstrate competent driving of Rescue RIB to the satisfaction of the Training Officer.	
11.	Completion of recognised Inshore Training Course  AYF Inshore Certificate of equivalent Current Waterways Authority Boating Licence Current First Aid Certificate Current Advanced Resuscitation Certificate ACA Radiotelephony Certificate  Multiple bar crossing can be made on one day but only *ONE crossing can be signed off per day Inshore training course to include white water training and headland familiarisation.
