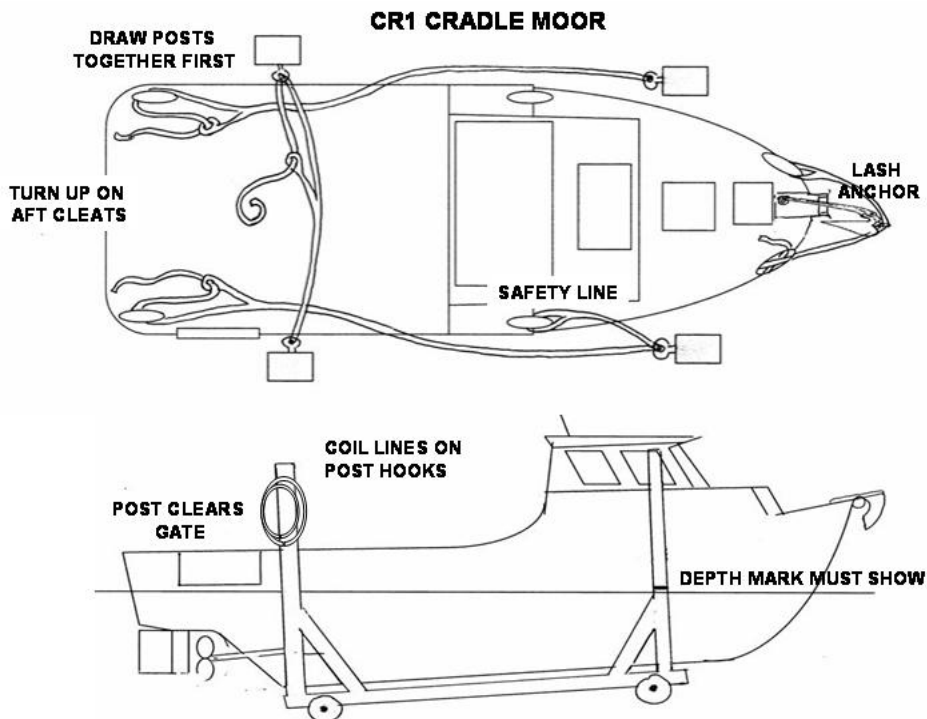


CC EX 5 – ASSIST IN BERTHING & ANCHORING PROCEDURES:

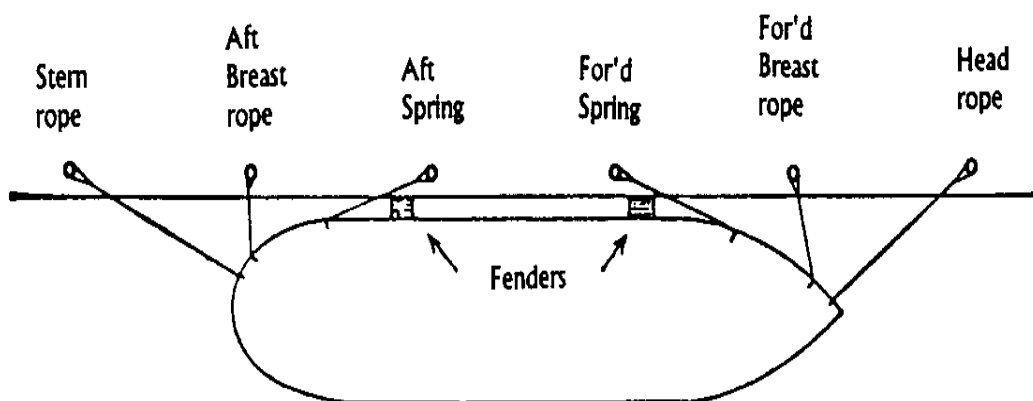
Task & Purpose: To practice a variety of berthing and anchoring skills and develop standard communication procedures.

ASSIST IN BERTHING

Practice departure/arrival in Crown - Lines should be let go as instructed by the skipper. When let go announce “the name of the line is clear!”



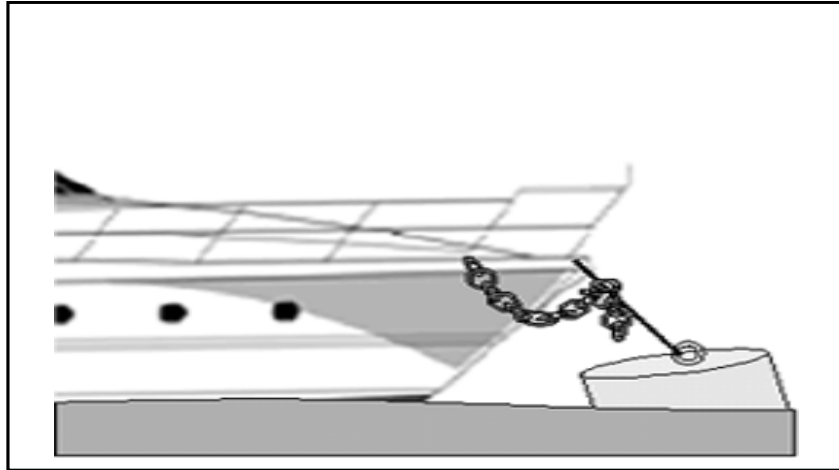
Practice departure/arrival at a wharf- Use slip ropes and motor off with a spring. Have a fender ready to fend off. On no account fend off larger vessels by use of hands.

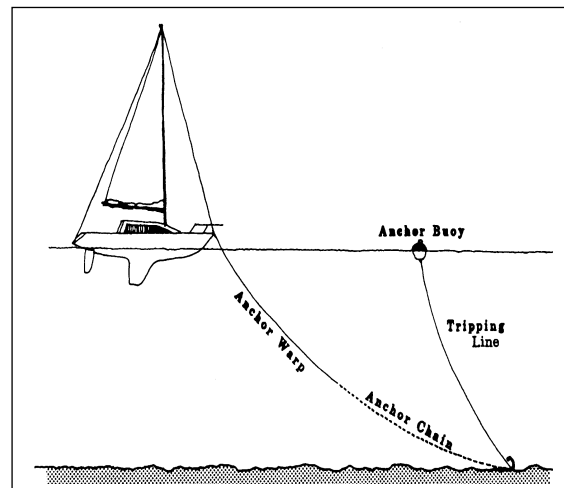
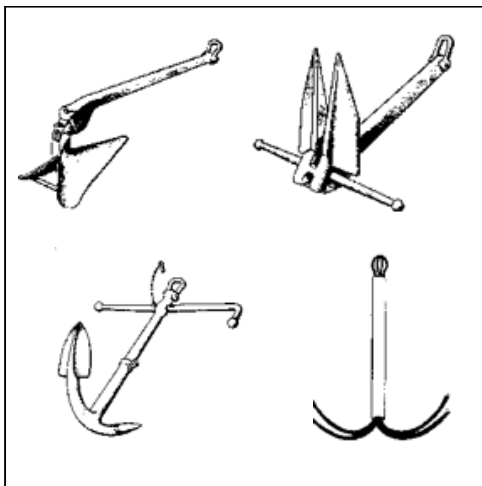
ASSIST IN MOORING TO A BUOY

Practice pick up and release in Crown/RIB - Lines should be let go as instructed by the skipper. When let go announce “the line is clear!”



ASSIST IN ANCHORING

Practice let go and weigh in Crown/RIB – Practice the communication skills required to work as a team. Learn the holding power and rode requirements of the anchor tackles used. Rig a “tripping line”. Rig a Baltic moor to control a leeward drift into danger.
